The global burden of snakebite envenoming:

- Every year, between 1.8 and 2.7 million people are seriously injured.
- 81,000–138,000 of them die.
- 400,000 of those who survive are left with serious, permanent disfigurement, disability and psychological strain.
- High treatment costs drag families into a vicious cycle of poverty.
- Antivenoms are indispensable for treating snakebite, but are often ineffective, unaffordable and inaccessible.
